
Subject : Deprecating practice of inscribing letters 'Nyaydish' on

Sir / Madam,

As per above referred letter No. RG/1611/60/2010, dated 1st June, 2010, it was instructed to stop the practice of inscribing letters 'Nyayadish' on private vehicles by the Judicial Officers. However, it is noticed that still some Judicial Officers have not followed the instructions and they display / inscribe the letters / words 'Nyayadish', 'Judge', 'Metropolitan Magistrate' / 'Magistrate' on their private vehicle. All Judicial Officers are directed to stop the said practice of inscribing the abovesaid letters / words on their private vehicle and follow the instructions scrupulously.

Subject: **Deprecating practice of inscribing letters
'Nyayadish' on the Private Vehicles.**


Sir,

It has been brought to the notice of Their Lordships that the Judicial Officers who do not avail the facility of Pool Cars but use their own car by availing petrol allowances inscribe letters 'Nyayadish' on their private vehicles. I have been directed to state that such practice has to be stopped immediately. No Judicial Officer is allowed to inscribe letters 'Nyayadish' on their private vehicles irrespective of the fact that such vehicle is used by him/her to commute between the place of residence and the court by availing petrol allowance. Further, the displaying of beacon light either on the pool vehicles

or on their private vehicles beyond their entitlement is required to be stopped forthwith.

I am, further to request you to bring this to the notice of the Judicial Officers working under you. Kindly acknowledge the receipt of the letter.
